What happens to your applicant data?

We pay particular importance to the protection of your personal data and are obliged to comply with the legal requirements on data protection in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (DSGVO) and the Data Protection Act (BDSG new), each in accordance to the German law

We process your applicant data on the basis of § 26 paragraph. 1 BDSG new.

We have taken technical and organizational measures to protect your data against accidental or intentional manipulation and unauthorized access. In the following we would like to inform you about the use of your personal data within the application process in our company.

Personal data at C. Cramer & Co. is subject to restrictive access control, which ensures that only authorized persons can access your data. In principle, your application data will only be used by the application processing unit (i.e. Human Resources department and department head of the target department) within the application process. Your data will be used exclusively for the application process. Any further use or transfer of your applicant data to third parties will not take place.

If we intend to process your applicant data for other purposes (for example, inclusion in a talent pool), we will seek prior written consent from you. Such consent is voluntary and revocable at any time without stating reasons.

Which data protection rights can you assert as a data subject?

You may request at the above address information on the processing of your personal data. In addition, under certain circumstances, you may request the correction or deletion of your data. You can still have a right to limit the processing of your data and a right to publish the information you provide in a structured, consistent and machine-readable format.

Right of objection

If we process your data on the basis of your consent or for the protection of legitimate interests, you can object to this processing for reasons that arise from your particular situation. We will then no longer process your personal information unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for processing that outweigh your interests, rights and freedoms, or the processing is intended to assert, exercise or defend legal claims.

Where can you complain?

You have the option of complaining to the above data protection officer or to a data protection supervisory authority. The data protection supervisory authority responsible for us is:

How long will your data be stored?

We delete your personal data as soon as it is no longer necessary for the defined purpose of the application processing. After completion of the application process, they will be deleted immediately, at the latest after 6 months, in compliance with the data protection regulations. In exceptional cases, personal data may be kept for the period in which claims can be asserted against us (statutory limitation period of three or up to thirty years).
